EQUIPMENT REQUIRED: Tools required for individual trade, stilts

MATERIAL REQUIRED: Materials for individual trade

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT: Steel-toed boots, hard hat

JOB STEPS:

1. Check your stilts prior to starting work to ensure they are in good condition.

- 2. Ensure the work area is free to debris and tripping hazards before starting work.
- 3. Ensure there are no open holes and be aware of stair cases.
- 4. Ensure all guard rails are properly in place. If there are no guard rails, contact your supervisor prior to starting work.
- 5. Be aware of the locations of plumbing, piping etc. protruding from the walls and floors. Cover or put up barricades if possible.
- 6. Never walk backwards on stilts without first checking for hazards behind you.
- 7. Take care around doorways and access points to avoid collisions with other workers. Watch where your head is in relation to the building.
- 8. Avoid walking underneath or beside a worker on stilts.
- 9. Avoid carrying heavy to awkward loads when walking on stilts.
- 10. Do not walk at heights such as planks or scaffold while wearing stilts.
- 11. Do not use stilts on uneven ground.
